Legislative Report November - December 2013

The MRSPA Legislative Workshop was held on November 14, 2013 in Annapolis at the Miller Senate office building. The day began with a presentation by Diane Oakley, director of the National Institute on Retirement Security. Ms. Oakley pointed out the importance of defined pensions not only to retirees but to the fiscal well-being of the state. Saving for retirement is very important and retirees who have a pension usually have their own personal retirement accounts as well.

Peter Franchot, Maryland State Comptroller and A. Melissa Moye, Chief Investment Officer reviewed the health of the Retirement and Pension System. Total returns have been strong, averaging 7.8% over the last 25 years and 10% over the last 3 years. Plan assets totaling \$40.25 billion indicate a recovery from the grim years 2008 and 2009. The fund is well diversified with public equity at 42% and 7 other pieces equaling 58%.

MRSPA Legislative Aide Tish Raff strongly encouraged everyone to contact legislators at least once during the Legislative session. Use the MRSPA web site especially checking Maryland Reports and Daily Updates. Use the site to access the Maryland General Assembly and to contact your representatives.

Policy Advisor, reviewed the transition occurring last spring in the county. He spoke about the appointment of Kenneth Maxwell as school CEO as well as school board appointees who better reflect families and parents in the county. He was most enthusiastic about the \$600 million hospital center due to open in 2016-2017.

The day was informative and fun. Lunch included the ultimate trick or treat bag complete with Slim Jims and fire balls. I encourage you to join us in Annapolis during the Legislative Sessions beginning in January.

Our very own Legislative trip to Annapolis is planned for Wednesday, March 19, 2014. We will leave PGCEA office at 8:45 am and return about 2:30 pm. While in Annapolis, we will sit in on short sessions of both House and Senate and tour the Governor's mansion. All of our Prince George's legislators will be invited to join us for lunch and to speak briefly to our group. There is no charge for this trip. PGPSRA Representation

Led by Bill Brown, Chair of the Legislative Committee of the Maryland Retired School's Personnel Association, representatives from all Maryland local associations attended the day-long workshop in Annapolis that discussed the issues due to come up during the 2014 legislative session. Prince George's County was represented by Sue Finan, Jannette Wundrow and Norma Martof. As explained in the MRSPA Legislative Brochure and referred to above, the issues to be emphasized this year are:

For Retirement and Pensions

- Full actuarial funding,
- defined benefits



increased understanding of the positive impact of pensions on the state economy

Health Care Concerns

- Protection of local retirees health care benefits
- Promoting long term solutions

These, and other issues are vital for us and are in jeopardy in legislatures throughout the country. Keep alert!


