Secretary Rona Kramer's Visit



It was a pleasure to have Department of Aging Secretary Rona Kramer speak with us at our November 16<sup>th</sup> meeting. She is a very vibrant, energetic lady, whose enthusiasm for keeping seniors healthy and safe is evident. She is a native of Montgomery County, attended public schools, the University of Maryland, where she earned a BA degree in law enforcement, went on to receive a law degree from the University of Baltimore School of Law, immediately became involved in community affairs, serving on numerous committees, was elected as a Maryland Senator from 2003 until 2011, when she and her brother, Delegate Ben Kramer (District 19) worked together in Annapolis to pass laws for the safety and well-being of seniors, and though she is a Democrat, was appointed by Governor Hogan to serve as the Maryland Secretary of Aging in 2015. Secretary Kramer encouraged everyone to follow a healthy diet, exercise (even moderately), and stay socially involved. She emphasized that there is help for disabled seniors and those needing assistance with health care for themselves or family members, by contacting the Prince George's Health Department/ Department of Aging Office. Also, there is a state-wide system called MAP (Medical Access Program) that you may contact online to learn where to get specific services of doctors, home care, support for hearing and disabled individuals, etc. Meals on Wheels and local Senior Centers are also administered under the Maryland Department of Aging. Secretary Kramer very graciously gave of her time following our meeting to speak individually with persons who had specific questions. She personifies her slogan of "Live Well - Age Well".



On Thursday November 10, 2016, Brenda Barnes, Lorraine Johnson, Jannette Wundrow, Elsie Fletcher and Sue Finan attended the MRSPA Legislative workshop in Annapolis. Speakers included MRSPA President Frances Miller, Legislative Chair Virginia Crespo, Legislative Aide Vera Torrence, Federal Relations Director, National Council on Teacher Retirement Leigh Snell, Secretary of Budget and Management David Brinkley, Teresa Lochte from the State Retirement and Pension office, Maryland State Treasurer Nancy Kopp and MRSPA Executive Director Shachar Weizman.

Their presentations focused on the need for us to be vigilant. We must watch policies concerning Defined Benefits and Health Care. Become familiar with the new MRSPA website, a great way to stay informed. Education throughout the state is a top priority and Governor Hogan is making necessary contributions to the Pension System which is now 70% funded. We were assured that a teacher who is starting a full career today will have pension benefits throughout their retirement.

A great way for you as a PGPSRA member to show your interest is to attend our Legislative Trip to Annapolis on Thursday March 9, 2017. We leave PGCEA in the morning arriving by bus to Annapolis to view an introductory film, sit in on The House and Senate, Tour Historic Rooms and The Governor's Mansion.
