Eugene is a member and historian for the Marion County Master Gardeners and a tutor/mentor for the Marion County Juvenile Detention Center. He has traveled extensively throughout North America, Europe, and Africa, as well as, the Caribbean Sea. At the present time, Eugene lives in Ocala, FL. with his soul mate, Anne Marie, and their beloved cats Timmy and Tracy. He has one son, William, and Daniel, who is like a second son, with whom he developed a special bond over the years.

Adrienne Cannon of Springfield, VA. retired from Eleanor Roosevelt High School as a Spanish and Italian teacher in 1996. LEGISLATIVE REPORT



In spite of the many challenges facing us today, our Legislative goals, reflecting the MRSPA goals, remain the same. They include:

Pension protection now and ensuring sustainability of the pension fund.

Protection of seniors and vulnerable adults from identity theft, fraud and scams.

Addressing the rising cost of long term health care.

Bringing technology programs to all seniors assuring them the ability to always stay connected.

In the July 2020 Maryland State Retirement and Pension System "News and Notes" Executive director R. Dean Kenderdine states:

"I would like to address a misconception that rears its head at times like these: the fear that the state is going to "raid" the pension fund. Be assured that the System's assets are not the state's piggy- bank. The assets of your System are held in trust for the exclusive purpose of providing benefits to the members and their beneficiaries. As a result, the state is not permitted to use System trust assets for other purposes. The trust is secure, and the assets are there to provide benefits to those who have earned them."

PGPSRA is not planning our annual Legislative trip to Annapolis in March 2021. We will keep you informed as to how you can continue to be active participants in the legislative process.
