Members signed up for several opportunities to support PGPSRA activities. We will help register participants at the Pre-Retirement Conference on March 14, 2015 at Eleanor Roosevelt High School. Additionally, members signed up to be delegates to the Annual Meeting on May 12, 2015 as well as to attend the play, 1776 at Toby's Theater and attend PGPSRA Lobby Day in Annapolis on March 18th.

Pension Reform and Retirees' Benefits

January 29, 2015 I attended a briefing on pensions at MSEA headquarters by Randy Meekins. The GOOD news is that Governor Hogan supports working toward full funding of the MSRPS by putting in the legislatively mandated amount of \$150 million of the previously required \$300 million to the fund. The fund is now nearly 80% funded and is recovering steadily. This session there are 70 freshmen in the Maryland Legislature—eight of them are Delegates in Prince George's County. Our Defined Benefits pension plan must be defended against a Defined Contribution retirement plan.

Pension reform shifted a portion of costs back to the local boards of education. According to Meekins this cost is more than originally calculated due to certain assumptions about the return on investments by the pension fund. In the news February 2^{nd} , cuts to education by the Governor amount to \$144 million across the state. The cut in state aid to government for Prince George's County is \$45 million of the designated \$1.3 billion.

According to MRSPA President Max Muller the BAD News is that proposed cuts to educational funding to local boards are of great concern. Muller says retirees need to be extremely vigilant and lobby and/or work with the Benefits Office, Superintendent, and Board of Education to ensure that our health benefits are not jeopardized.

Numbers do count. We must continue to make our retiree voices heard. Contact your legislators before, during, and after the session. Contact your County Council representative and Board of Education representatives also.

We remember our old friend Fred Rummage who passed away this fall. Fred was the Executive Director for PGCEA and a former Maryland delegate (1966-1986. He was the mayor of Colonial Beach, VA until shortly before his death.



LEGISLATIVE REPORT

Delegate Jay Walker, chair of the Prince George's County delegation, was a guest on the afternoon news on January 26th. He addressed the issue of education funding in the state as a high priority especially in Prince George's county. Governor Hogan has stated that the GCEI requirement in the state school funding formula will be cut between \$20 and \$40 million for Prince George's county. Delegate Walker said that there is work to be done. He also spoke about the building of the Purple Line, which would connect Prince George's and Montgomery counties. Local funds are necessary to meet the goal. The Federal funding has been acquired. However, if the Purple Line is not built, the Federal funds revert back to the government; they may not be used for another project. The money would be lost to Maryland. Governor Hogan has not acted on this piece at this time.

Delegate Walker was pleased that monies will be allocated for the planned Regional Hospital in Largo.

Our own Legislative trip to Annapolis is on Wednesday March 18, 2015. You still have plenty of time to sign up or email me at sfinan77@gmail.com. MRSPA will guide you when you wish to communicate with your legislators. Finding Your Local Legislators

Click on internet explorer, or yahoo, then type in http://mdelect.net/ Look half way down the page for this language "Find your Federal and State Elected Officials". Fill in your address in the address blank. Click on the text "Find elected officials". The listing of your local legislators will appear on the left side of the page.

Contacting Your Legislators

- 1 -When calling your legislator in Annapolis, dial toll-free: 301-970-5400, or 410-946-5400, and ask to be connected to the office of your legislator.
- 2 -When e-mailing your Delegate, type in your delegate's name with a period separating the first and last name (Michael.busch) and add @house.state.md.us (*The final e-mail address would then read Michael.busch@house.state.md.us) OR when e-mailing your Senator, type in your senator's name with a period separating the first and last name (george.edwards) and add @senate.state.md.us (*The final e-mail address would read Joanne.benson@senate.state.md.us)
- 3- When hand-writing your legislator, you would need to call the Annapolis toll-free number to ask his/her specific building and room number, though the ending would be Annapolis, Maryland, 21401-1991.
