PGPSRA Community Services Chair Moving Out of State

Ethel L. Brown, long-time chair of the PGPSRA Community Services Committee, has notified the organization that she will be moving out of state.

The committee also works with five high school students each year to offer matriculation fees and program assistance provided by PGPSRA.

Ethel has also volunteered as a pediatric aide at Greater Southeast Community Hospital, served as a new teacher mentor at Bowie State University, and was Minority-Affairs Co-Chair for Prince George's County.

In 2018 Ethel was inducted into the Maryland Senior Citizens Hall of Fame.

LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

County Executive Alsobrooks was the guest at the Prince George's Delegation meeting in Annapolis on January 11, 2019. She told of her priorities: education, both classroom and building construction, and universal pre-k, and then, referred to the Kirwin Report, saying there is casino money, and many aspects of the report should be implemented without hesitation. Ms. Alsobrooks wants to see more physical activity in schools, along with, nutrition classes. Ms. Alsobrooks plans to be in Annapolis every Monday at 6 p.m. to speak with any legislators, who have questions about how her office and the county can work together on specific projects.

On January 25, 2019 the Delegation guest was Dr. Monica Goldson, CEO, Prince George's County Public Schools. Dr. Goldson emphasized the need to retain quality staff in the schools by providing a pay scale that is competitive with surrounding areas. She stressed the need for increased safety in schools, reduced class size, pre K in all schools, funding for school renovations and new construction and addressing the needs of the whole child to facilitate greater success.




