LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE

At the January 31, 2020 Prince George's Delegation meeting, we heard from Dr. Charlene Dukes, Prince George's Community College President, Dr. Monica Goldson, Prince George's County Public Schools CEO and Dr. Alvin Thornton, Board of Education Chair. Each guest emphasized the need to fully fund Education in Maryland at all levels. President Dukes wants to see a continuation of the great gains made in curriculum and professor salaries as well as in social services to assist low income students. Sadly, Dr. Dukes will be stepping down as President in June and our own PGPSRA; Oretha Bridgwaters-Simms is chair of the search committee for the next President.

Dr. Goldson and Dr. Thornton both spoke about community schools and wrap around services for students. These services include academic, social and emotional support as well as physical and mental health care.

Two very talented students also spoke about their experiences and the opportunities afforded them. Jeremy, a senior at DuVal HS, will have 30 college credits along with a high school diploma when he graduates. He will continue his education in the field of aerospace. Vanessa, a senior at High Point HS, will attend The University of Rochester with a full scholarship in Political Science.

Attending a delegation meeting during legislative session keeps you informed first-hand about our county.
