

However, it was closed after a period, and used for offices, thus her involuntary transfer to Chillum Elementary, from which she retired in 1985. After retiring Jane substituted for a while in both Prince George's and Montgomery Counties. Afterward, she volunteered with SOME (So Some May Eat), Everybody Wins at Marie Reed Elementary, Special Olympics, Saint Ann's Home, Martha's Table, and as an usher and greeter at Asbury U.M. Church in Washington. Jane belongs to a Fraternal Organization that holds their annual conferences in August, when she attends. She has traveled east and west, north and south, and to many of the states in between – and to Canada – but no cruises (too much water!).

Godelieve Bartley retired as a special education kindergarten teacher from Wheatley Early Childhood Center in 2002.
