Legislative Report May 2020

As luck would have it, PGPSRA managed to visit Annapolis for our March 5th Legislative trip. From our group photo with our sponsor Delegate Susie Proctor and Senator Mike Miller on the State House steps to our luncheon gathering with several delegates and aides, the trip was a success. Once again, our guide was Mary Mulvihill who led us through the Senate, House, the Historic Rooms and Government House. At lunch, we had 26 members in attendance and were visited by 6 Delegates, 3 Legislative Aides and of course, Senator Joanne Benson, who is a regular guest.

The 2020 Legislative Session ended quite abruptly. According to The Washington Post (3-19-2020) "As law-makers hurtled toward adjournment, they passed a \$47.5 billion budget with little debate and steered about \$100 million toward combating the public health crisis and economic fallout from the pandemic." "Lawmakers approved an education overhaul that would pump as much as \$4 billion annually into public schools by 2030 and prescribe policies designed to make Maryland schools among the best in the nation." The bill, though passed, has safeguards in place if adjustments are needed in this time of economic uncertainty.
