From the President:

As we approach this season of Thanksgiving I surveyed the world as we know it and, believe it or not, found a lot of things for which to be thankful.

In September PGPSRA held its first General Membership meeting via Zoom. We had 42 "attendees" and heard a wonderful presentation from Kriste Kidd, senior advisor for the Oasis Senior Living Program. The "attendees" joined in from as far away as Arizona and North Carolina, and received information about funding options to keep monthly housing costs low, independent living, retirement communities, assisted living, residential care homes, memory care, skilled nursing facilities, respite services, hospice, and more. Then, thankfully, the November Election is essentially behind us--or not!! (Remember that crystal ball I talked about in previous messages? The one that I do not have?)

The November PGPSRA General Membership meeting will again be offered via Zoom, on Wednesday, Nov. 18, 11 a.m. Prince George's County Executive Angela Alsobrooks has agreed to be our speaker. She will undoubtedly discuss progress being made against Covid-19 and other matters of importance to county residents.

If you wish to "attend" the virtual meeting, you will need to send your name and **email address** to Dr. Vest at his email address provided on the form. More information will be provided to those who register. In order to participate you MUST provide Dr. Vest with your name and email address by Nov. 10.

The Community Service Committee is working with schools to continue to provide the outstanding service for which PGPSRA is known. The Scholarship Committee is contacting schools to solicit applications for PGPSRA scholarships.

The Scholarship Committee also has decided to offer two \$300 mini-grants to teachers or paraprofessionals to support student needs-based projects that are not covered by the school system or parent-teacher organization. This program will mirror one offered by MRSPA. The deadline for our local mini-grant program will be announced at a later date. This will be the first time that PGPSRA has offered these mini-grants independently.

PGPSRA continues to work with the Maryland Retired School Personnel Association (MRSPA) to insure that due diligence is given to protecting our retirement pensions. We hope that you will encourage retirees you know who are not members to join PGPSRA and MRSPA as soon as possible. There is strength in numbers.

There are, indeed, many things for which to be thankful. Thank you for every act of kindness you have shown to fellow retirees and other residents of our community. Please continue to be strong.

We continue to need your help, and thank everyone making contributions to assist us.



Charline Jacob, Life-Long Educator, Passes

PGPSRA mourns the passing of long-time member and community servant Charline Jacob. Charline served as an educator for 38 years in the Prince George's County Public Schools, retiring from James McHenry Elementary School in 1997.

She was an active member of the Prince George's Public School Retirees Association, where she chaired the Membership Committee.

She was also involved in a number of community organizations, including serving on the Board of the Family Crisis Center of Prince George's County, where she was a tireless advocate for victims of domestic violence. Charline supported cancer patients as a Patient Care Volunteer with Hospice of the Chesapeake.

Charline was a graduate of Dillard University in New Orleans, LA, an initiate of Beta Upsilon Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority Inc., and charter member of Iota Gamma Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.



She served in many leadership positions in the Dillard University National Alumni Association and the Dillard University Metro Washington, D.C. Alumni Association, and for more than 50 years championed the mission of Dillard University and HBCUs across the nation.

Among her many honors were induction into the Maryland Senior Citizens Hall of Fame, recipient of Dillard University's Henry Lucas Service Award for Alumni, and nomination for the National Black College Alumni Hall of Fame Foundation's Hall of Fame Legacy of Leaders award.

On the home front, Charline shared her life with her 104 year old mother.

The family has indicated that she continued to be an educator well past her retirement, donating her body to science for educational uses. A virtual memorial service was held for her in late October.

We will miss Charline and wish the best for her mother and family.

PGCPS Benefits—Addie Martin

As you may know, even though medical claims have increased significantly in our county, the PGCPS continues to share the cost (80%) for our medical, prescription drug, vision and dental coverage. The spike in claims has affected our co-payments for our prescription drugs for not only retirees but active employees as well.

Please remember that Open Enrollment (always in October) is your once a year opportunity to review your options and select the medical benefits that work best for you. During Open Enrollment you can:

Drop your current coverage – if you drop coverage, you will not be able to re-enroll at a later date;

Drop dependents – if you drop a dependent, that dependent will not be able to enroll at a later date; or

Switch medical plans from CareFirst to Kaiser Permanente or from Kaiser Permanente to CareFirst.
