Ways to Vote in Prince George's County

Vote Early

A registered voter can visit ANY early voting site in Prince George's County to cast his/her ballot. If you decide to vote early, you cannot vote by mail or on Election Day.

Vote By Mail

Any registered voter can request a mail-in-ballot. To request a mail-in-ballot, call the Prince George's County Board of Elections on (301) 341-7300 or visit http://elections.mypgc.us/ click on "voter information" and mail-in ballots to download an application. You can also text "VBM" to 77788. Once you receive your ballot, you must fill it out, seal the envelope, sign and date the oath on the back of the envelope. You can hand deliver your ballot to the Board of Elections Office, place it in your local mailbox or the nearest drop box. The instructions and more information on deadlines will be included in your mail-in ballot packet.

Vote on Election Day

On Tuesday, November 8, 2022 Gubernatorial General Election Day, you should vote at your assigned polling place. All polling places will open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.
