Senator Mike Miller Honored

The University of Maryland has announced that its main administration building will be named the Miller Building in honor of long-time Maryland Senator Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr. Sen. Miller was honored for his exceptional work in advocating for higher education that has resulted in convincing the state to invest in building and improving campus facilities that have included the arts, sciences, communications, and sports programs.

Sen. Miller began his political career as a Maryland Delegate in 1970, and was elected to the Senate in 1974, all the while representing District 27 (Prince George's, Calvert, and Charles Counties). By overwhelming votes among his legislative colleagues, from 1987 until January 8, 2020, he became Maryland's longest-serving Senate President. During his political career, Sen. Miller received many awards for his community and state work on transportation, housing policy, school construction, historic preservation, law enforcement, restructuring the electric utility industry, preserving the Chesapeake Bay, setting standards for Veterans' Homes and nursing homes, and numerous other projects, but his main focus has always been on education.

Senator Miller, with his legislative photographer, has for 20 years, welcomed our PGPSRA members who travel to Annapolis for our annual "Legislative Day" each March.

We welcome three new members to our membership. Our current total membership for the county is 1,258, with 80 Emeritus members, and 814 of these are dues deductible. 
