Greetings PGPSRA Members,

It is hard to believe that we are midway through Spring and rapidly approaching Summer. A lot has happened since our last newsletter.

We were saddened to learn of the passing of Quinn Patterson, President-Elect of PGPSRA, in early March. Many members of our organization attended a Memorial Service in his honor. Then we were elated that Lorraine Johnson, former PGPSRA President and current Vice President of MRSPA, agreed to finish Quinn's term as President-Elect and become our President in July. She was elected unanimously to the President-Elect position at the March meeting. The **Scholarship Committee** has identified two applicants to receive scholarships from PGPSRA. The **Community Service Committee** will present graduation and prom assistance to five seniors from Friendly High School. In a unique circumstance, the seniors will not be present at our meeting due to their graduation ceremonies being held the same day, but will be with us via a video presentation produced by the school exclusively for our meeting. The May 23 meeting will be held at the Comfort Inn in Bowie. Please see the registration form elsewhere in this issue.

Our **Travel Committee** is booking reservations for two outings in the coming months. Interested members can tour the 911 Call Center in Bowie on May 16, receive hands-on training in CPR and AED, and enjoy lunch. 




