Speakers included State Retirement Agency of Maryland's Executive Director, Dean Kenderdine. Mr. Kenderdine said that "The pension system is doing well and getting better all the time." The goal of 80% funded by 2025 is well on its way at 71%. The agency is improving their computer system to better serve members and fully protect our information. The agency has hired three new staffers and has added several additional funds to their portfolio. This will allow them to maximize benefits.

Prince George's Delegate Alonzo Washington spoke about moving legislation toward free tuition for Community College, paid sick leave, and more attention to the Arts in schools.
